On October 26, 2018, the agency screened-in a CPS Report alleging neglect to the 2-week-old infant by his mother and father. During the course of the assessment, an additional referral was received regarding the infant's death. The Initial Assessment completed by the agency found insufficient evidence to substantiate neglect of the infant by the mother and father. The agency closed the case upon completion of the Initial Assessment.

An assessment was completed by the agency and the allegation of physical abuse was unsubstantiated. The case was closed upon completion of the Initial Assessment.

The agency collaborated with law enforcement and medical personnel to complete the assessment. The Initial Assessment completed by the agency found insufficient evidence to substantiate neglect of the infant by the mother and father. The Medical Examiner's Office noted no signs of maltreatment or trauma to the infant. The agency determined the infant's
