The agency collaborated with law enforcement and medical professionals to complete the assessment. The Initial Assessment completed by the agency found a preponderance of the evidence to substantiate maltreatment of physical abuse to the infant by the infant's mother. Medical professionals determined the injuries were consistent with non-accidental head trauma. The agency deemed the infant unsafe and initiated a Protective Plan. Subsequently, the infant was taken into Temporary Physical Custody. Upon discharge from the hospital, the infant was placed in a non-relative foster home. A Child in Need of

	Protection or Services Petition was filed, and the case remained open to provide ongoing case management services.
