Summary of all involvement in services as adults under ch. 48 or ch. 938 by child's parents or alleged maltreater in the previous five years:

The mother and adjudicated father participated in the Safety Services program from 10/26/09 - 1/26/10, at which time the case was closed as there were no safety concerns.

Summary of actions taken by the agency under ch. 48, including any investigation of a report or referrals to services involving the child, any member of the child's family living in this household and the child's parents and alleged maltreater at the age of 18 years or older:

A 12/27/10 referral alleging sexual abuse to the toddler by an unknown maltreater was screened in, assessed and unsubstantiated.

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An 11/02/09 referral alleging neglect to the infant (now two-year-old) by the mother was screened out as No Threat or Harm of Maltreatment.

A 10/20/09 referral alleging physical abuse by the mother to the infant (now two-year old) was screened in. The allegation was assessed and substantiated for physical abuse to the infant by the father. The family was referred to the safety services program, which they worked with from 10/26/09 - 1/26/10, at which time the case was closed as the child was determined to be safe.

Summary of any investigation conducted under ch. 48 or ch. 938 and any services provided to the family since the date of the incident:

The agency screened in and assessed the allegations of physical abuse to this toddler. The toddler presented with multiple injuries which were determined to be highly indicative of physical abuse. The mother was unable to provide reasonable explanations for the injuries and the toddler was unsupervised with multiple caregivers during the time her injuries were inflicted. The allegation is substantiated as physical abuse to the toddler by an unknown maltreater.

The toddler was taken into protective custody on 9/26/11 and determined to be in need of protection and services at the detention hearing on 9/28/11. The toddler was placed in out-of-home care and the family is receiving ongoing case management services.

The agency conducted an assessment and substantiated physical abuse to the toddler by an unknown maltreater. The toddler was taken into protective custody on 9/26/11; a Temporary Physical Custody hearing took place on 9/28/11 and the toddler was determined to be need of protection and services. The toddler was placed in out-of-home care and the family continues to receive ongoing case management services.
