Physical abuse to the infant by the father was substantiated. The agency determined the children were safe in the care of the mother. The father has bond conditions per criminal court which prohibits contact between the father and the infant. The father is allowed supervised contact with the 4-year-old per his bond conditions. The parents signed a six month Informal Disposition Agreement and the family continues to receive ongoing case management services.
