The mother stated fell asleep with the infant while feeding him. Another adult entered the home and found the infant non-responsive. The ther stated she was taking prescription pain medication at the time of the infant's death. The infant died from asphyxiation. It agency learned of this incident via the local news, contacted law enforcement, and filed a report on 4/29/2013 alleging lect to the child by the child's mother. A criminal investigation is pending.

The Ass	agency collaborated with law enforcement and the medical examiner's office to complete the assessment.
