The agency screened in and assessed the allegation of physical abuse to the child. The Initial Assessment completed by the agency found a preponderance of the evidence to substantiate physical abuse to the child by the mother. The mother was incarcerated for this incident and the child was placed in foster care. After six days, the child was returned to the care of his father. The agency filed a Child in Need of Protection or Services with juvenile court and opened the case for ongoing case

	management service. The child was referred for screening for proper development which found no concerns for the child.
