Summary of any investigation involving the child, any member of the child's family and alleged maltreater conducted under ch. 48 or ch. 938 and any services provided to the child and child's family since the date of the incident:

Eau Claire County Department of Human Services screened in the CPS report alleging physical abuse to the child. The agency requested Clark County Department of Social Services complete an independent assessment for Eau Claire County Human Services due to a conflict of interest. Clark County Department of Social Services collaborated with law enforcement and medical personnel to complete the assessment. The Initial Assessment completed by the agency found a preponderance of the evidence to substantiate physical abuse to the child by an unknown maltreater. The agency found insufficient evidence to name a specific maltreater in this case. The agency determined the child and his sibling as unsafe and took temporary physical custody and placed them with relatives. The agency filed a Child in Need of Protection or Services Petition with juvenile court, which was dismissed with the agency's determination that the parents were not responsible for the child's injuries. The children were returned to the care of their parents and the case was closed. A subsequent Initial Assessment was completed by Eau Claire Department of Human Services alleging physical abuse to the child by the babysitter. The agency found insufficient information to substantiate physical abuse to the child by the day care provider, and closed the case.
