Description of the incident, including the suspected cause of death, injury or egregious abuse or neglect:

On January 21, 2014, the agency received a report regarding a nine-year-old child pronounced deceased in his home. The mother was the primary caretaker for the child who had special needs. The mother left a suicide note, which indicated her depression had become worse. Law Enforcement responded to the residence when called for a welfare check and found the mother and child deceased. The Medical Examiner determined the child died from asphyxia due to mechanical obstruction of the upper airways, and law enforcement's investigation concluded the mother was responsible for the child's death.

Findings by agency, including maltreatment determination and material circumstances leading to incident:

The agency collaborated with law enforcement and medical professionals to complete the assessment. The Initial Assessment completed by the agency found a preponderance of the evidence to substantiate maltreatment of physical abuse to the child by the mother. The Medical Examiner's Office determined the official cause of the child's death was asphyxia due to mechanical obstruction of the upper airways. The agency closed the case as both family members were deceased.

At the time of the incident, the child resided with his mother. The child's father did not have contact with the child.

The agency was providing voluntary child welfare services to the family at the time of the incident. The child was in respite care every other weekend, Friday through Sunday, from September 2013 through January 19, 2014. The agency's last contact with the mother occurred by telephone on October 18, 2013. The agency had additional telephone contacts with collaterals to coordinate services for the family, the last of which occurred on January 15, 2014.

Summary of all involvement in services as adults under ch. 48 or ch. 938 by child's parents or alleged maltreater in the previous five years: (Does not include the current incident.)

On December 20, 2012 the agency screened-in a CPS Report alleging physical abuse to the child by the mother. An assessment was completed, which determined the child safe, and the allegation of physical abuse was unsubstantiated. The family was referred to community resources and the agency opened the case to provide child welfare services. The family was involved in child welfare services from January 11, 2013 to June 27, 2013. Upon closure of child welfare services on June 27, 2013, the mother was connected with another community resource for ongoing support.

On September 10, 2013, the agency screened-in a Services Report requesting services for the family. The agency provided the mother with community resources and made a referral for respite care services. The family was involved in respite care services every other weekend from September 20, 2013 to January 19, 2014.

On July 15, 2013, the agency screened-in a Services Report requesting services for the family. The agency provided the mother with community resources and made a referral for respite care services.

On September 10, 2013, the agency screened-in a Services Report requesting services for the family. The agency provided the mother with community resources and made a referral for respite care services.

On September 11, 2013, agency screened-out a Services Report.

The agency collaborated with law enforcement and medical professionals to complete the assessment. The Initial Assessment completed by the agency found a preponderance of the evidence to substantiate maltreatment of physical abuse to the child by the mother. The Medical Examiner's Office determined the official cause of the child's death was asphyxia due to mechanical obstruction of the upper airways. The agency contacted the adjudicated father as he was next of kin; however, he wanted to relinquish his next of kin rights to the child's grandmother. The agency closed the case as both family members were deceased.
