Description of the incident, including the suspected cause of death, injury or egregious abuse or neglect: On April 8, 2014, the agency received a report regarding a three-year-old child brought to the hospital with head injuries Medical professionals who examined the child suspected head trauma due to the child's presenting symptoms, so the child wa transported to another hospital. Law enforcement was contacted and initiated a criminal investigation regarding the child's suspicious injuries.
The mother reported she went to work at 5:30 a.m. and left her child in the care of her boyfriend. The mother reported she texted her boyfriend at 9:45 a.m. to ask how things were going and the boyfriend responded that he had called emergency responders. The mother's boyfriend reported that around 9:00 a.m. the child was eating breakfast, but had to use the bathroom. The mother's boyfriend stated he heard a "thud" come from the bathroom and went to check on the child. The mother's boyfriend stated the child was on the floor crying. The mother's boyfriend indicated there were clothes on the floor and the child may have slipped on the floor. The mother's boyfriend indicated he tried to perform CPR on the child and called paramedics.
Medical personnel diagnosed the infant with Physical Abuse-Abusive Head Trauma. As a result of law enforcement' investigation, the mother's boyfriend was arrested and criminally charged with one count of Child Abuse-Recklessly Cause Great Harm. A criminal charge is merely an allegation and a defendant is presumed innocent until and unless proven guilty.
Findings by agency, including maltreatment determination and material circumstances leading to incident: The agency collaborated with law enforcement and medical personnel to complete the assessment. The Initial Assessment completed by the agency found a preponderance of the evidence to substantiate maltreatment of physical abuse to the child by mother's boyfriend. Medical professionals determined the child sustained head injuries and diagnosed the child with Abusive Head Trauma. The mother's boyfriend's version of events did not match the explanation for the child's injuries. The mother' boyfriend was criminally charged and court ordered to have no contact with the child. Upon discharge from the hospital, the child will be placed in the mother's care after she was assessed as protective. A Child in Need of Protection or Services petition was filed and the case remained open to provide ongoing case management services.
