The agency collaborated with law enforcement and medical personnel to complete the assessment. The Initial Assessment completed by the agency found a preponderance of the evidence to substantiate maltreatment for physical abuse to the children by the children's mother. Medical professionals stated that the injuries to the children were diagnostic of physical abuse and inflicted injury. The 10-year-old, 11-year-old and their two siblings were deemed unsafe, taken into Temporary Physical Custody, and placed in a non-relative foster home. The case remained open to provide ongoing case management services.
