The agency collaborated with law enforcement and medical personnel to complete the assessment. The Initial Assessment completed by the agency found insufficient evidence to substantiate maltreatment of neglect to the child and to the child's three siblings by the mother and the father. The child's siblings were deemed unsafe, taken into Temporary Physical Custody, and placed in out-of-home care with a relative. A Child in Need of Protection or Services Petition was filed and the case remained open to provide ongoing case management services.
