The agency collaborated with law enforcement and medical personnel to complete the assessment. The Initial Assessment completed by the agency found a preponderance of the evidence to substantiate maltreatment of physical abuse to the infant by her mother, and neglect to the infant by her mother and father. Medical professionals determined the injuries to the infant were non-accidental in nature. The infant and her 2-year-old brother were deemed unsafe, taken into Temporary Physical Custody, and placed with relatives. A Petition for Protection or Services was filed and the case remained open to provide ongoing case management services.
