Description of the incident, including the suspected cause of death, injury or egregious abuse or neglect:  On December 27, 2019, the agency received a report regarding an 8-month-old infant who was pronounced deceased in his home on December 26, 2019. The Medical Examiner's Office noted no signs of trauma to the infant. Toxicology results are pending. Law enforcement was contacted and initiated a criminal investigation. No criminal charges have been filed in this case, and the investigation remains open.
Findings by agency, including maltreatment determination and material circumstances leading to incident:  The agency collaborated with law enforcement and medical personnel to complete the assessment. The Initial Assessment completed by the agency found insufficient evidence to substantiate maltreatment of neglect to the infant by the mother. The Medical Examiner's Office noted no signs of trauma to the infant. Toxicology results are pending. The infant's siblings remained in-home under a Protective Plan until the agency determined the children safe. The family was referred to community services and the agency closed the case upon completion of the Initial Assessment.
