On October 19, 2017, the agency screened-in a CPS Report alleging neglect of the child by the father and the stepmother. An assessment was completed by the agency, and the allegation of neglect was unsubstantiated. The case was closed upon completion of the Initial Assessment.

On March 14, 2017, the agency screened-in a CPS Report alleging neglect of the child by the father and the stepmother, and physical abuse of the child's now 9-year-old half-sibling by the stepmother. An assessment was completed by the agency, and the allegations of neglect and physical abuse were unsubstantiated. The case was closed upon completion of the Initial Assessment.

On August 30, 2016, the agency screened-in a CPS Report alleging neglect of the child by the father and the stepmother. An assessment was completed by the agency, and the allegation of neglect was unsubstantiated. The case was closed upon completion of the Initial Assessment.

On March 10, 2014, the agency screened-out a CPS Report.

Summary of any investigation involving the child, any member of the child's family and alleged maltreater conducted under ch.
48 and any services provided to the child and child's family since the date of the incident:

The agency collaborated with law enforcement and medical professionals to complete the assessment. The Initial Assessment completed by the agency found a preponderance of the evidence to substantiate maltreatment of neglect of the child by the father and the stepmother. The Initial Assessment completed by the agency found insufficient evidence to substantiate physical abuse of the child by the father and the stepmother. Medical professionals indicated the injuries were consistent with non-organic failure to thrive. The agency deemed the child and the child's half-siblings unsafe and initiated a Protective Plan. Subsequently the Protective Plan was terminated for all of the children. The child was taken into Temporary Physical Custody and placed with the child's 9-year-old half-sibling's mother. The child's 6-year-old and 4-year-old half-siblings were deemed safe, and they remained with the child's father and their mother. The agency deemed the child's 9-year-old half-sibling safe, and he remained in his mother's care. Petitions for Protection or Services were filed for all of the children, and the cases remained open to provide ongoing case management.
