The agency collaborated with law enforcement and medical professionals to complete the assessment. The Initial Assessment completed by the agency found insufficient evidence to substantiate sexual abuse or neglect to the infant by an unknown maltreater. The Medical Examiner's office has not determined the infant's cause of death; the autopsy report is pending. The agency determined the infant's 10-year-old sibling unsafe and initiated a Protective Plan. Subsequently, the father was assessed as safe, and the 10-year-old sibling remained with the father. The agency determined the infant's 15-year-old and 8-year-old half-siblings unsafe and initiated a Protective Plan. Subsequently, the mother was assessed as safe, and the infant's half-siblings remained with the mother. The agency closed the case upon completion of the Initial Assessment
