Description of the incident, including the suspected cause of death, injury or egregious abuse or neglect: On April 17, 2023, the agency received a report regarding an infant brought to the hospital with head injuries. Law enforcement was contacted and initiated a criminal investigation. Medical professionals determined the injuries were consistent with non-accidental head trauma. As a result of law enforcement's investigation, both the mother and the father were criminally charged with Second Degree Recklessly Endangering Safety and Neglecting a Child-Consequence is Great Bodily Harm. A criminal charge is merely an allegation, and a defendant is presumed innocent until and unless proven guilty.
Findings by agency, including maltreatment determination and material circumstances leading to incident: The agency collaborated with law enforcement and medical professionals to complete the assessment. Medical professionals determined the injuries were consistent with non-accidental head trauma. The Initial Assessment completed by the agency found a preponderance of the evidence to substantiate neglect by the mother and physical abuse by the father. The infant was deemed unsafe, taken into Temporary Physical Custody, and placed in a non-relative foster home. A Petition for Protection or Services was filed, and the case remained open to provide ongoing case management services.
