The agency collaborated with law enforcement and medical professionals to complete the assessment. The Medical Examiner's Office noted no signs of trauma to the child and determined the cause of death was due to controlled substance toxicity. The Initial Assessment completed by the agency found insufficient evidence to substantiate neglect of the child by the mother. The agency determined the child's half-siblings safe, and they remained with their mother. The agency closed the case upon completion of the Initial Assessment, and no service referrals were made.
