Qualified ResidentialTreatment Programs (QRTP)



What is a QRTP?

A QRTP is congregate care facility that is designed for youth with serious mental health or behavioral needs. Facilities seeking certification as a QRTP must meet the following elements:



Why QRTP is Important and the benefits?

The Family First Prevention Services Act of 2018 implemented new criteria for the use of federal funds for child welfare services.

- Wisconsin benefits from the new funding model that allows for Title IV-E reimbursement for all youth who receive services in a certified ORTP.
- Allowable IV-E reimbursement includes supportive services to best meet the treatment needs of youth, family-based aftercare support services, and post-discharge services.
- Wisconsin reimbursement rates for services provided may be higher for certified QRTPs. <u>DSP Informational Memo Series 2021–32i</u>
- The required element of a Trauma Informed Treatment Model (TITM), as part of certification as a QRTP, may enhance the quality of care provided to youth. <u>DCF's example of a TITM</u>

How to apply for QRTP Certification?

Licensed group homes, residential care centers, and shelter care facilities may apply for certification.

- The DCF Child Welfare Licensing Section (CWLS) website offers a complete list of requirements and application for certification.
- Technical assistance is available from CWLS staff to assist all applicants.
- Accreditation is required and information may be found here: <u>Council on Accreditation (COA)</u>, <u>Commission on Accreditation of Rehabilitation Facilities (CARF)</u>, <u>Joint Commission</u>, and other independent, not-for-profit accrediting organizations approved by the <u>U.S. Department</u> of Health and Human Services.

Provider Considerations

- **Begin the accreditation** process. It can take up to 18 months.
- Review current treatment model and fidelity applied to it. Is it trauma-informed? Is it designed to be short-term and goaloriented?
- Identify family and youth engagement process and policies; ensuring coordination throughout treatment.
- Assess programs and services offered onsite and align with QRTP requirements.
- Think about physical location and array of services available to youth and families; and determine best approach in providing family-based aftercare supportive services to ensure timely reunification and supports postdischarge.
- Review service array and determine if it's broad enough to ensure ongoing viability with emphasis on preventing future congregate care placement.
